FORMER INTERIOR MINISTER SAYS CIVIL WAR IS COMING SOON IN FRANCE

USPA NEWS - The outgoing French Interior Minister warns in his farewell speech against the critical situation of the suburbs and the rise of violence in France and announces that "France is close to a" Civil War "against terrorists and drug traffickers, who apply the law of the strongest "in the French suburbs. This alarmist alert occurred during the handing over, on 3 October 2018, of the resignation of Gerard Colomb, Minister of the Interior, which he pronounced thus at Place Beauveau (Ministry of the Interior), the resignation chose to to leave the government for reasons of "disagreement" and also to pray for the next municipal elections or he represents himself at the city hall of Lyon.

Gerard Collomb, during his last speech of Minister of the Interior warned the Prime Minister by declaring that "France is close to the civil war and that it fears for the future"

Gerard Collomb also added that: "Today, we live side by side. Me, I always say it: I fear that tomorrow we live face to face ". A scary scenario "that completely destroys the myth of 'living together' gargling the right-thinking and right-wing".
